Thames Freeport is committed to best practice in all aspects of corporate governance. As part of this commitment, all members of the Governing Body and its Committees are required to exercise independent judgement in the best interests of the Freeport and should not be perceived to be unduly influenced by external factors in their decision-making. This includes fully disclosing any actual, perceived or potential conflicts of interest.

The Freeport asks all members of the Governing Body and its Committees to identify and declare their interests in line with its Conflict of Interest Policy. The declaration should be completed on appointment, and annually thereafter. Members are requested to notify the Chair of any changes as they occur to ensure the Register of Interests is kept up to date. In addition, members should also declare any conflict of interest arising from an agenda item of a meeting on the Declaration of Interests during a Meeting Form.

The onus is on members to consider any interests they may have, as well as any potential conflict of interests of immediate family members. The following table seeks to assist in disclosing the information.

Members of the Board and its Committees must also comply with the Freeport's Subsistence and Hospitality Policy, ensuring members do not benefit from their position with the Freeport in a way which might reasonably be seen to compromise personal judgment or integrity.

In the interest of openness and transparency, all offers of hospitality made over the value of £25 should be declared, indicating whether it has been declined or accepted, using the Declaration form within 28 days of receipt of the offer.
